As written, the show navigates through ten various settings and follows a complicated web of unrequited love and heartbreak while also giving a valiant effort at normalizing love at first sight and dropping everything that you value to follow a dream, all in a comedy that is less than 2 hours long! Oh, and there are a few dream sequences thrown in for good measure. Like I said, it's a beast.

I went through various ideas of how to tackle this project in a way that kept the spirit of the comedy alive and also made sense from a storytelling standpoint, and I hope you enjoy where we landed. As one of the actors reminded me, this show is about the music, and the music IS the story. Elvis Presley was the definition of an icon. His music, his dancing, his clothes, everything about him changed American pop culture in ways that are unparalleled to this day, and All Shook Up is a celebration of that moment in time.



The "Talk-Back" is a structured Q&A discussion where the director is asked questions about the show and it's process.



Heather Steele began directing theater productions while still in high school, back in the 1900s. In the 30 years since, she estimates that she has directed more than 50 productions. Heather has directed several student productions for Center Stage Academy, and this is her second mainstage show with Center for the Arts. She is starting her 4th year as a part of the CFTA administrative team, and is currently the Program Director, overseeing the art gallery, Vocal Academy, and other community outreach programs.
