DIRECTOR'S NOTE

In January of 2022, my best friend sent me a text one morning, saying that she had gotten a director's slot at our local community theater. I didn't know what the play was, but from the title it seemed as though it centered around a strange sort of animal, so I congratulated her and simply moved on. Later, that same month, she texted me and asked if I was planning on auditioning. I hopped on the internet and Googled the show. Turned out I was wrong, and it was not, in fact, about that strange sort of animal, but rather, an even stranger town in New York, so I put my name down. Many auditions and callback sides later, I got a call from her that I had gotten a role in the show. The cast was a soulmate cast with incredible chemistry, hilarious timing, and the biggest hearts I've ever seen. I wanted so badly to do the show over and over again after we closed. I got such a chance almost exactly three years later. In a very similar sequence of events, I got a text a few months ago that CFTA was doing my beloved play, and later got notified that I was being asked to direct it. Luckily, the same circumstances befell me as that of 2022; the cast is a soulmate cast, with even more chemistry, hilarity and heart than I could have ever imagined. I've been in the theatre industry for a long time given my young life, and have spent a long time with actors. This is a show about actors, the theatre, and the dramatics that follow them. All I have to say is...everything that happens in this show is only minorly exaggerated.

Thank you, audiences, for coming and supporting live theater, for supporting my cast, crew, and myself, and also thank you in advance for laughing. You'll be doing that a lot over the next two hours. Lastly, Reagan, Joey, Brad, Stacey, Tiff, Karen, Mette, and Ethan: This is for you, I hope I do you justice, and did somebody say nose?

In the madcap comedy tradition of Lend Me a Tenor, the hilarious Moon Over Buffalo centers on George and Charlotte Hay, fading stars of the 1950s. At the moment, they're playing Private Lives and Cyrano De Bergerac in rep in Buffalo, New York with five actors. On the brink of a disastrous split-up caused by George's dalliance with a young ingénue, they receive word that they might just have one last shot at stardom: Frank Capra is coming to town to see their matinee, and if he likes what he sees, he might cast them in his movie remake of The Scarlet Pimpernel. Unfortunately for George and Charlotte, everything that could go wrong does go wrong, abetted by a visit from their daughter's clueless fiancé and hilarious uncertainty about which play they're actually performing, caused by Charlotte's deaf, old stage-manager mother who hates every bone in George's body.

Ken Ludwig has had six productions on Broadway and eight in London's West End. His 34 plays and musicals are staged around the world and throughout the United States every night of the year.


His first play, Lend Me a Tenor, won two Tony Awards and was called "one of the classic comedies of the 20th century" by The Washington Post. Crazy For You is currently running on London's West End. It was previously on Broadway for five years, on the West End for three, and won the Tony and Olivier Awards for Best Musical.

In addition, he has won the Edwin Forrest Award for Contributions to the American Theatre, two Laurence Olivier Awards, two Helen Hayes Awards, the Charles MacArthur Award and the Edgar Award for Best Mystery of the Year. His other plays include Moon Over Buffalo, Leading Ladies, Baskerville, Sherwood, Twentieth Century, Dear Jack, Dear Louise, A Fox on the Fairway, A Comedy of Tenors, The Game's Afoot, Shakespeare in Hollywood and Murder on the Orient Express. They have starred, among others, Alec Baldwin, Carol Burnett, Kristen Bell, Tony Shaloub, Joan Collins and Henry Goodman.

His book How to Teach Your Children Shakespeare, published by Penguin Random House, won the Falstaff Award for Best Shakespeare Book of the Year, and his essays on theatre are published in the Yale Review. He gives the Annual Ken Ludwig Playwriting Scholarship at the Kennedy Center American College Theater Festival, and he served on the Board of Governors for the Folger Shakespeare Library for ten years. His first opera, Tenor Overboard, opened at the Glimmerglass Festival in July 2022. His most recent world premieres were Lend Me A Soprano and Moriarty, and his newest plays and musicals include Pride and Prejudice Part 2: Napoleon at Pemberley and Lady Molly of Scotland Yard.



The "Talk-Back" is a structured Q&A discussion where the director is asked questions about the show and it's process.


